




- Torque wrench



Gearmotor may be operated in positions 1, 2, 3 or 4 (Figure 3).



2. Install spider bushing (**Figure 4, item 1**) in three jaw coupling (**Figure 4, item 2**).



3. Rotate conveyor belt and attached conveyor coupling (Figure 5, item 1) to align with gearmotor coupling (Figure 5, item 2).



Installation

 Slide mounting screws (Figure 6, item 1) through slots (Figure 6, item 2) in gearmotor bracket (Figure 6, item 3). Rotate gearmotor assembly into desired position.



5. Tighten screws (**Figure 7, item 1**) to 146 in–lbs (16.5 N–m) and install anti rotation pin (**Figure 7, item 2**).



1. Remove cover (Figure 8, item 1).



2. Determine wiring configuration (**Figure 9**).



3. Install cord grip and power cord (**Figure 10, item 1**) mount to terminal box as required.



Preventive Maintenance and Adjustment

Required Tools

- Hex-key wrenches: 2 mm, 2.5 mm, 3 mm, 5 mm
- Adjustable wrench (for hexagon head screws)
- · Straight edge
- · Torque wrench

Gear Motor Replacement

A WARNING

LOCK OUT POWER BEFORE WIRING.

- 1. Disconnect power and remove terminal box cover.
- 2. Record wire colors on terminals 1, 2 and 3 (**Figure 11, item 1**). Loosen terminals and remove wires



Loosen cord grip (Figure 11, item 2) and remove power cord.

A WARNING

Gearmotor can rotate and fall off, causing injury.

Support the gearmotor prior to removing anti rotation pin.

 Loosen the four (4) coupling lock screws (Figure 12, item 1), remove anti rotation pin (Figure 12, item 2). Rotate and remove gearmotor assembly.



5. Remove the four (4) gearmotor coupling guard screws (Figure 13, item 1) and remove the gearmotor coupling guard (Figure 13, item 2) and mounting ring (Figure 13, item 3).



Preventive Maintenance and Adjustment

6. Loosen set screw (**Figure 14, item 1**) and remove 3 jaw coupling (**Figure 14, item 2**).



7. Remove snap in cover (**Figure 15, item 1**) on opposite side of gearhead.



8. Remove shaft mounting bolt (**Figure 16, item 1**) and remove shaft.



9. Insert the new shaft (**Figure 17, item 1**) and key (**Figure 17, item 2**) into new gear reducer. Tighten screw (**Figure 16, item 1**) to 35 in-lb (4 N-m).



- 10. Snap on cover (Figure 15, item 1).
- 11. Install 3 jaw coupling (**Figure 18, item 1**) so that the shaft is even with the coupling, and tighten set screw (**Figure 18, item 2**) to 45 in–lbs (5 N–m).




- 12. Install gearmotor coupling guard (**Figure 13, item 2**) and mounting ring (**Figure 13, item 3**) to gearmotor, and tighten screws (**Figure 13, item 1**) to 110 in-lb (12 N-m).
- 13. Complete steps 2 through 5 of "Mounting" section beginning on page 6.



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Return Policy

Returns must have prior written factory authorization or they will not be accepted. Items that are returned to Dorner without authorization will not be credited nor returned to the original sender. When calling for authorization, please have the following information ready for the Dorner factory representative or your local distributor:

- 1. Name and address of customer.
- 2. Dorner part number(s) of item(s) being returned.
- 3. Reason for return.
- 4. Customer's original order number used when ordering the item(s).
- 5. Dorner or distributor invoice number (if available, part serial number).

A representative will discuss action to be taken on the returned items and provide a Returned Goods Authorization (RMA) number for reference. RMA will automatically close 30 days after being issued. To get credit, items must be new and undamaged. There will be a return charge on all items returned for credit, where Dorner was not at fault. It is the customer's responsibility to prevent damage during return shipping. Damaged or modified items will not be accepted. The customer is responsible for return freight.
