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Warnings - General Safety

DO NOT OPERATE CONVEYORS IN AN EXPLOSIVE ENVIROMENT. The electric gearmotor generates heat and could ignite combustible vapors. Failure to comply will result in death or serious injury.



ADJUSTMENT SCREWS. Loosening stand height or angle adjustment screws may cause conveyor sections to drop down, causing serious injury.

Installation

Caution

Dorner recommends cleaning all the "food zones" prior to placing conveyor into service. Ensure adequate access is provided for cleaning and servicing equipment so that the required level of hygiene can be maintained.

Note

Proper conveyor application, cleaning and sanitation are the responsibility of the end user.

Caution

Conveyor MUST be mounted straight, flat and level within confines of conveyor. Use a level during setup.

Required Tools

- Level
- 10 mm Hex Wrench

Typical Frame Connection Components (Figure 2).

- 1 Conveyor Frames
- 2 Connector Hex Rods (x2)
- 3 Hex Head Cap Screws (x4)
- 4 O-ring (x8)



1. Locate the section number sequence etched on each section of frame (Figure 3, item 1).

- 2. Position the frame sections in the correct order.
- 3. Place the idler tail (Figure 4, item1) in the UP position.

4. Connect the frame sections by bolting the hex post connectors (Figure 5, item 1) to the sections of frame.

5. Slide the belt (Figure 6, item 1) over the conveyor frame (Figure 6, item 2).

6. Align the sprockets (Figure 7, item 1) with the cogged drive teeth (Figure 7, item 2) on the inside of the belt.





Note: The cogged drive teeth on the belt (Figure 7, item 2) should engage the deep grooves of the sprocket (Figure 8, item 1).

Belt Return Installation

Flat Belt

Typical Flat Belt Return Components (Figure 9).

1 Flat Belt Returns



1. Slide the return shaft (Figure 10, item 1) up and through the large slot (Figure 10, item 2) in the frame.

2. Push up on the return shaft (Figure 11, item 1) and slide the notched end of the shaft through the small slot (Figure 11, item 2) on the opposite side of the frame.

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Cleated Belt

Typical Cleated Belt Return Components (Figure 12).

1 Cleated Belt Returns

Insert the notched end of the return shaft (Figure 13, item 1) through the small hole (Figure 13, item 2) in the inside of the conveyor frame.

2. Repeat the procedure for all other belt returns.

Limiter Installation

Flat Belt

Typical Flat Belt Limiter Components (Figure 14).

- 1 Limiter
- 2 Limiter Support Plates (x2)
- 3 Hex Head Cap Screws (x4)



Cleated Belt

Typical Cleated Belt Limiter Components (Figure 15).

- 1 Limiter (x2)
- 2 Limiter Support Plates (x2)
- 3 Hex Head Cap Screws (x4)

Installation

1. Bolt limiter support plates (Figure 16, item 1) to conveyor frame stand off posts (Figure 16, item 2).

2. Insert limiter (Figure 17, item 1) between support plates (Figure 17, item 2).

Belt Tensioning

- Do not tension the conveyor belt.
- Conveyors are shipped at proper tension.
- Over tensioning of the conveyor will cause the conveyor to run improperly.
- Some belt slack is required for proper operation (Figure 18).

Return Policy

Returns must have prior written factory authorization or they will not be accepted. Items that are returned to Dorner without authorization will not be credited nor returned to the original sender. When calling for authorization, please have the following information ready for the Dorner factory representative or your local distributor:

- 1. Name and address of customer.
- 2. Dorner part number(s) of item(s) being returned.
- 3. Reason for return.
- 4. Customer's original order number used when ordering the item(s).
- 5. Dorner or distributor invoice number.

A representative will discuss action to be taken on the returned items and provide a Returned Goods Authorization number for reference.

There will be a return charge on all new undamaged items returned for credit where Dorner was not at fault. Dorner is not responsible for return freight on such items.
