



Specifications

Fixed and Adjustable Stand Models



Example: 39MFA12-1267FA

Fully adjustable height, H style stand for a 12" (305mm) wide conveyor with a minimum height of 12" (305mm) and a maximum height of 67" (1702mm) with fixed foot pads. It comes fully assembled and has U.S. English documentation.

Recommended Installation Sequence (see Table of Contents for page numbers)

- Assemble stand(s), if required
- Attach stand(s) to conveyor
- Attach optional diagonal bracing (see Diagonal Brace Kit Manual)
- Adjust stand height and angle (see Adjustment section, page 9)

Assembly

Stands Shipped Partially Assembled

Required Tools

- 5 mm Hex Key Wrench
- 6 mm Hex Key Wrench
- 17 mm Open–End Wrench (stands with casters, only)

- 1. Typical components (Figure 2).
 - Leg Support Bracket (2x)
- 2 Hardware Pack, Crossmember (quantity as required)
- 3 Hardware Pack, Fully Adjustable Stand
- 4 Pivot Bracket (2x)
- 5 Crossmember (no crossmember on 7"–19" (178mm–483mm) high stand with feet or 12"–19" (305–483mm) high stand with casters)
- 6 Plastic Tree Rivet (4x)
- 7 Tube End Cover (2x)
- 8 Stand Leg/Foot Assembly (2x) (used on stands with feet) or Stand Leg Assembly (2x) (used on stands with casters)
- 9 Caster Kit (2x) (used on stands with casters)



NOTE

7"–19" (178mm–483mm) high stands with feet and 12"–19" (305–483mm) high stands with casters do not use a crossmember. For assembly of these stands, continue with step 7.

2. Open crossmember hardware pack (Figure 2, item 2).

Install four button head screws (Figure 3, item 1) and hex nuts (Figure 3, item 2) on crossmember (Figure 3, item 3). Do not tighten screws.



 Align hex nuts (Figure 4, item 1) on crossmember (Figure 4, item 2) to t-slots (Figure 4, item 3) at top of stand leg (Figure 4, item 4). Slide crossmember to bottom of stand leg. Do not tighten screws.



- 5. Repeat step 4 for opposite stand leg.
- 6. Tighten four button head screws (**Figure 5, item 1**) to 150 in–lb (17 N–m).



NOTE

Steps 7 and 8 apply to stands with casters only. For stands with feet, go to step 9.

Caster Kit (Figure 2, item 9) Components:

- 1 Caster
- 4 Lock Nut

(Discard enclosed carriage bolt)

Open caster kit (Figure 2, item 9). Install caster (Figure 6, item 1) over bolt (Figure 6, item 2). Bolt is preassembled on stand leg (Figure 6, item 3). Secure caster with lock nut (Figure 6, item 4).



8. Tighten lock nut (**Figure 7, item 1**) to 30 ft–lb (40 N–m).



NOTE

Pivot bracket (Figure 8, item 1) must be installed on side of leg support (Figure 8, item 2) opposite of warning label (Figure 8, item 3). When installed, round end of pivot bracket will be down and warning label will be upright, as shown.

Screws (Figure 8, item 4) for attaching pivot brackets (Figure 8, item 1) to support legs (Figure 8, item 2) must be installed in opposite set of holes on opposite support leg to properly attach pivot brackets to conveyor.

Open fully adjustable stand hardware pack (Figure 2, item 3). Attach pivot bracket (Figure 8, item 1) to leg support (Figure 8, item 2) with two flange socket head screws (Figure 8, item 4). Do not tighten screws.



- 10. Repeat step 9 for opposite pivot bracket (see note, above).
- 11. Install two button head screws (**Figure 9**, **item 1**) and hex nuts (**Figure 9**, **item 2**) on leg support (**Figure 9**, **item 3**). Do not tighten screws.



12. Repeat step 11 for opposite leg support.

13. Align hex nuts (**Figure 10**, **item 1**) on leg support (**Figure 10**, **item 2**) to t—slots at top, outside of stand leg (**Figure 10**, **item 3**). Slide leg support down stand leg until conveyor mounting holes (**Figure 10**, **item 4**) on pivot bracket (**Figure 10**, **item 5**) are approximately the same height as the lower t—slots on conveyor. Tighten button head screws (**Figure 10**, **item 6**) just enough to keep leg support in position.



- 14. Repeat step 13 for opposite stand leg.
- 15. Install one t-bar (**Figure 11**, **item 1**) in bottom t-slot on each side of conveyor (**Figure 11**, **item 2**).



Make sure conveyor section is properly supported and at the proper height and angle before attaching stand.

16. Attach pivot bracket (**Figure 12**, **item 1**) to t-bar (**Figure 11**, **item 1**) with two socket head screws (**Figure 12**, **item 2**). Do not tighten screws.



17. Repeat step 16 for opposite stand leg.

A WARNING

Failure to secure screws (Figure 10, item 6) may cause conveyor sections to drop down causing severe injury.

TIGHTEN SCREWS (Figure 10, item 6) AFTER ADJUSTMENT.

18. Tighten four socket head screws (**Figure 12**, **item 2**) to 124 in–lb (14 N–m).

- 19. Tighten four flange socket head screws (**Figure 8, item 4**) to 24 ft-lb (33 N-m).
- 20. Tighten four button head screws (**Figure 10, item 6**) to 17 ft-lb (22.5 N-m).
- 21. For final height and angle adjustments see page 10.
- 22. Attach tube end cover (**Figure 12**, **item 3**) on stand leg (**Figure 12**, **item 4**) with two plastic tree rivets (**Figure 12**, **item 5**).
- 23. Repeat step 22 for opposite stand leg.

Stands Shipped Fully Assembled

- 1. No stand assembly is required.
- 2. To attach stand to conveyor, see steps 15 through 18 starting on page 7.
- 3. For final height and angle adjustments see page 10.

Preventive Maintenance and Adjustment

Stand Height Adjustment

Required Tools

• 6 mm Hex Key Wrench

- 1. Support conveyor section (**Figure 13, item 1**).
- Loosen two flange socket head screws (Figure 13, item 2) on each pivot bracket (Figure 13, item 3).
- 3. Loosen two button head screws (**Figure 13, item 4**) on each leg support (**Figure 13, item 5**).
- 4. Slide both leg supports (**Figure 13, item 5**) up or down on stand legs (**Figure 13, item 6**) to the required height. If necessary, adjust height of each leg support until conveyor is level from side to side.





Failure to secure screws (Figure 13, item 4) may cause conveyor sections to drop down causing severe injury.

TIGHTEN SCREWS (Figure 13, item 4) AFTER ADJUSTMENT.

- 5. Tighten four button head screws (**Figure 13, item 4**) to 17 ft–lb (22.5 N–m).
- 6. Tighten four flange socket head screws (**Figure 13, item 2**) to 24 ft–lb (33 N–m).



Preventive Maintenance and Adjustment

Conveyor Angle Adjustment

Required Tools

• 6 mm Hex Key Wrench



Loosening stand height or angle adjustment screws may cause conveyor sections to drop down, causing severe injury.

SUPPORT CONVEYOR SECTIONS PRIOR TO LOOSENING STAND HEIGHT OR ANGLE ADJUSTMENT SCREWS.

Loosen two flange socket head screws (Figure 14, item 1) on both sides of stand.




2. Adjust conveyor to desired angle.



3. Secure flange socket screws (**Figure 14**, **item 1**) to 24 ft-lb (18 Nm).

4. If conveyor is equipped with diagonal bracing (Figure 15, item 1), socket head screw (Figure 15, item 2) must be loosened to adjust conveyor angle. Secure screw to 100 in–lb (11 N–m) after angle adjustment.






Return Policy

- 2. Dorner part number(s) of item(s) being returned.
- 3. Reason for return.
- 4. Customer's original order number used when ordering the item(s).
- 5. Dorner or distributor invoice number.

A representative will discuss action to be taken on the returned items and provide a Returned Goods Authorization number for reference.

There will be a return charge on all new undamaged items returned for credit where Dorner was not at fault. Dorner is not responsible for return freight on such items.
